The Concessions Program will provide the highest quality and variety of foods, goods and services at reasonable prices to enhance the public's use and enjoyment of the District's properties. The Program will also increase the concession opportunities across the District to attract small, local, MBE, and WBE businesses to address equity issues for concessionaires. In addition to generating non-tax revenue for the District, the Concessions Program will streamline the approval process.
