Corps Goals




Bring diverse populations to the Forest Preserves that reflect the diversity of Cook County.



Help the Forest Preserves restore lands back to health







Benefits of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding

Focuses on:

- Improvements to Forest Preserves in low-income communities
- Employment of people who reside in low-income communities

Youth Programs

Halts a 30-50% budget cut

Adult Programs

 Triples funding for people with barriers to employment





What will ARPA Fund?

FOTFP Forest Preserves Experience

- 5-week summer youth paid employment.
- Housing Authority of Cook County
- **\$1,120,000**

SCA Gap Year Program

- 6-month program for young adults
- Prepares youth alumni for adult programs
- **\$415,000**

Greencorps Chicago

- 9-month training program
- Focus on adults with barriers to employment
- **\$1,300,000**





Job Readiness, **Environmental Education and Green Career Exposure**















Measuring Program Success

- 65 to 95% retention rate
- 60 to 90% obtain job post program (adults)
- 90% would recommend to a friend
- 60% reported visiting the preserves more often after program
- 90% agreed that it helped them gain basic and/or technical job skills
- 50% were interested in conservation / science careers post program
