PROPOSED RESOLUTION

TO AUTHORIZE THE FOREST PRESERVE DISTRICT OF COOK COUNTY TO ENTER INTO A LOCAL AGENCY AGREEMENT FOR THE NORTH BRANCH BICYCLE TRAIL-SOUTHERN EXTENSION

WHEREAS the Forest Preserve District of Cook County (the "Preserves") has sought, and been awarded, funds from the Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Grant ("CMAQ Grant"), a federally-funded program administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation ("IDOT") that supports surface transportation projects and other related efforts that contribute air quality improvements and provide congestion relief, to facilitate the construction of 2.96 miles of the North Branch Bicycle Trail-Southern Extension;

WHEREAS, "IDOT" requires a resolution to reaffirm the Preserve's funding commitment for Phase III (construction supervision) and construction costs associated with the project as per the Local Agency Agreement;

WHEREAS, the Local Agency Agreement also provides for the division of Phase III and Construction costs for the Project and payment of 20% of the construction cost by the Preserves, as the Local Agency;

WHEREAS, CMAQ provides 80% (or maximum of \$424,000.00) of Phase III Engineering costs for the Project estimated at \$530,000.00;

WHEREAS, in order to meet deadlines for use of the funds provided via the CMAQ Grant, it was advisable that a consulting engineering firm be employed to perform Phase III engineering;

WHEREAS, the Preserves has selected URS Corporation "URS" of Chicago, Illinois to serve as Consulting Engineers;

WHEREAS, "URS" Phase III Engineering costs are projected to be \$527,793.89 of which CMAQ funds

will cover 80% (\$422,235.11) of the costs and the Preserves shall be responsible for 20% of the cost; **WHEREAS**, the total construction cost for the project is *estimated* at \$6,710,000.00 and the Preserve's 20% local share of the construction cost is *estimated* at \$1,342,000.00;

WHEREAS, IDOT shall be responsible for the bid letting and award of a construction contract at a future date;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Forest Preserves of Cook County authorizes the Preserves, through its General Superintendent, to enter into a local agency agreement (the "Local Agency Agreement"), with the Illinois Department of Transportation ("IDOT") via which the Preserves agrees to pay 20% of the Phase III Engineering Service and Construction costs associated with the Project pursuant to the Local Agency Agreement;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that URS Corporation of Chicago, Illinois be employed to perform Phase III Engineering services in connection with the Project, and that the President of such Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to execute, on behalf of the District, an agreement by and between the Preserves and URS for Phase III Engineering services (the "Engineering Services Agreement").

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, the Board of Commissioners of the Preserves hereby confirms that sufficient funds are available in the Preserves Construction & Development Fund, General Consulting accounts, Grant account, and Trail accounts have been designated, to pay the total cost of Phase III Engineering services in the amount not to exceed \$527,793.89 of which the Illinois Department of Transportation will reimburse 80% or up to \$422,235.11 and the Preserves ultimately shall be responsible for 20% of the Phase III Engineering costs or \$105,558.78, in addition to 20% of the construction costs not to exceed \$1,342,000.00

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of the Local Agency Agreement and the Engineering Services Agreement, when executed in their respective final form, shall be submitted to the Illinois Department of Transportation for approval and final processing.

PROPOSED LICENSE REQUEST

Request: Requesting authorization for the Forest Preserve District of Cook County ("the Preserves"), as Licensor to grant a License to The Village of Niles, Illinois ("the Village") to locate, operate and maintain a 72-inch storm sewer and outfall structure to the North Branch Chicago River. The storm sewer is part of a storm water relief program that also includes a detention basin and bioinfiltration facility on other village property. The sewer will capture storm water runoff to relieve flooding and to reduce the combined sewer overflow discharge. The request also includes licensing the existing combined sewer overflow structure for which no license or agreement is known. The Village will also construct a new ADA crosswalk on Caldwell Avenue at Cleveland Street with push button activated flashers, and a new paved trail connection, along the route of the new storm sewer, to the existing North branch Trail. The crossing will improve accessibility and safety and provide an alternative to the current use of the FPCC driveway and parking lot to access the trail.

FOREST PRESERVE FEE SCHEDULE

Amending the Forest Preserve District of Cook County Code of Ordinances to facilitate the ability to obtain a permit for activities such as rallies, pickets, protests, speeches, and demonstrations.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Forest Preserve District of Cook County Board of Commissioners, that Title 7 - Fees, Chapter 1 - Fee Schedule of the Forest Preserve District of Cook County Code is hereby amended as follows:

7-1-1: FEE SCHEDULE

Picnic Permits*.....

• Picnic Permits - one grove per permit, fees assessed for all permits; large groups may require multiple

permits and/or security.

Picnic permit category W = 25 to 99 people

Picnic permit category X = 100 to 399 people

Picnic permit category Y = 400 to 999 people

Picnic permit Level 4 = Large area events

• Special use permits: special accommodations such as tents, beer truck, caterer, rides, generator, lights,

overflow parking. A special use permit will be required for the aforementioned accommodations

even if

- a picnic permit is not required based on the size of the group.
- Special activity/event permits: activities not included in picnic permits and/or special use permits. Usually sold to a group.
- Rallies, pickets, protests, speeches, and demonstrations involving 25 or more persons shall be considered

activities requiring special event permits.

• Nonprofit organizations with proper documentation may qualify for a reduced rate of 50% on designated

picnic permit charges.
