Summary: On 4/29/2015, the Cook County Board approved a contract with Constellation Energy Services (Contract No. 1428-13749) (the "County Contract"). On 11/17/2015, the Forest Preserves Board approved the Forest Preserves piggybacking off the County Contract.

On 2/7/2018, the Cook County Board approved an increase and consolidation of two (2) one-year renewal options to

provide for the continuation of the supply and delivery of electricity under the County Contract. The County Contract was extended until 12/31/2020. The Forest Preserves would like to continue to piggyback off the County Contract through 12/31/2020 by exercising the second of two (2) one-year renewal options. The Forest Preserves is also requesting authority to increase the contract as additional electric accounts have been added that were not included in the original estimate from 2015 and the Forest Preserves intends to purchase Renewable Energy Credits (RECs).
